Hotel Performance - NI

January-August 2023

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for January-August 2023 indicate hotel room occupancy experienced no change while bed occupancy declined marginally compared with the same pre-pandemic period. Year-to-date sales were below those achieved during January-August 2019. Room occupancy for August 2023 fell by 3 percentage points and room sales declined by 12% compared to August 2019.

Room and Bed Occupancy

- Northern Ireland (NI) year-to-date (YTD) hotel room and bed occupancy figures sit at 68% and 54% respectively. These figures represent no change in room occupancy and a 2 percentage point decline in bed occupancy compared to 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room occupancy in August 2023 (78%) was down by 3 percentage points compared to August 2019. August room occupancy this year also decreased by 2 percentage points compared to last month (July 2023 – 76% room occupancy).
- NI's 2023 YTD hotel room occupancy is 3 percentage points higher than last year (January-August 2022).

Room and Bed Sales

- YTD room sales remain 7% below January-August 2019.
 This is one percentage point lower than the figure reported in last month's report.
- Room sales in the month of August 2023 declined by 12% compared to August 2019. We had previously seen a monthly decrease in room sales in June and July 2023 vs 2019.
- YTD bed sales for January-August 2023 decreased by 3% compared with 2019.
- Bed sales in August 2023 decreased by 9% on 2019. This followed from an 8% decline in bed sales reported in July 2023 on the 2019 figure.
- Compared to last year (2022), January-August 2023 room and bed sales are both 3% below 2022 levels.

January-August 2023

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for January-August 2023 indicate that guesthouses, guest accommodation and B&Bs (GH/GA/BB) experienced increases in both room occupancy and sales compared to 2019 and 2022 figures. Performance suggests this sector is continuing to progress better in its recovery than hotels.

Room and Bed Occupancy

- Northern Ireland (NI) guest houses, guest accommodation and B&Bs (GH/GA/BB) have had a positive January-August 2023 period, with room and bed occupancy experiencing growth of 4 and 5 percentage points respectively compared to 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room occupancy in the month of August 2023 experienced a decline of 4 percentage points compared to the same month in 2019, the first fall recorded after seven consecutive months of growth vs 2019.
- GH/GA/BB room occupancy has decreased by 1 percentage point, while bed occupancy has decreased by 5 percentage points, in comparison to last month (July 2023).

Room and Bed Sales

- There have been over 368,000 rooms and 704,000 bed spaces sold in guest houses, guest accommodation and B&Bs in January-August 2023.
- NI GH/GA/BB room sales for January-August 2023 have increased by 14% compared to January-August 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room sales in August 2023 fell by 4% compared to August 2019. This follows on from increases in each of the previous seven months.
- GH/GA/BB room sales for January-August 2023 are on par with room sales in the same period last year (January-August 2022).

January-August 2023

Room and bed-space occupancy varied across Local Government Districts (LGDs) during January-August 2023. Belfast City LGD recorded the highest room occupancy (55%), while Lisburn & Castlereagh LGD recorded the largest increase in room occupancy compared with January-August 2019 (+15pps).
