### Hotel Performance - NI

## January-December 2023

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for January-December 2023 indicate hotel room and bed occupancy experienced minor decreases compared with the same pre-pandemic period. Year-to-date sales were below those achieved during January-December 2019. Room occupancy for the month of December 2023 fell by 3 percentage points and room sales declined by 12% compared to December 2019.

### Room and Bed Occupancy

- Northern Ireland (NI) year-to-date (YTD) hotel room and bed occupancy figures sit at 65% and 53% respectively. These figures are just below the 2019 rates, with a 2 percentage point fall in both room and bed occupancy in 2023.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room occupancy in December 2023 (51%) was down by 3 percentage points compared to December 2019.
   December room occupancy in 2023 increased by 2 percentage points compared to last month (November 2023 49% room occupancy).
- NI's 2023 YTD hotel room occupancy is 1 percentage point lower than in January-December 2022.

### Room and Bed Sales

- YTD room sales remain 10% below January-December 2019, which is 1 percentage point less than the figure reported last month.
- Room sales in December 2023 decreased by 12% compared to December 2019, following monthly falls in room sales in September and October 2023 vs 2019.
- YTD bed sales for January-December 2023 decreased by 3% compared with 2019.
- Bed sales in December 2023 decreased by 1% on 2019.
   This follows on from an 11% fall in bed sales in November 2023 v November 2019.
- Compared to 2022, January-December 2023 room and bed sales are 9% and 4% down, respectively.

### GH/GA/BB Performance - NI

## January-December 2023

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for January-December 2023 indicate that guesthouses, guest accommodation and B&Bs (GH/GA/BB) experienced increases in both room occupancy and sales compared to 2019 and 2022 figures. Performance suggests this sector is continuing to progress better in its recovery than hotels.

### Room and Bed Occupancy

- NI guest houses, guest accommodation and B&Bs
   (GH/GA/BB) had a positive January-December 2023
   period, with room and bed occupancy increasing by 5 and 8
   percentage points respectively compared to 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room occupancy in the month of December 2023 increased by 6 percentage points compared to the same month in 2019.
- GH/GA/BB room and bed occupancy both fell by 3 percentage points compared to last month (November).
- Guesthouse and guest accommodation recorded room occupancy rates of 44% and 45% respectively for the period January-December 2023, while B&B's recorded a lower room occupancy of 26%.

#### Room and Bed Sales

- More than 533,000 rooms and just over 1 million bed spaces were sold in guest houses, guest accommodation and B&Bs in January-December 2023.
- This represents growth of 16% and 23% respectively compared to January-December 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room sales in December 2023 increased by 27% compared to December 2019. This follows an increase of 30% in November 2023 compared with the same month in 2019.
- GH/GA/BB room sales for January-December 2023 are 4% lower than room sales in the same period in 2022.

### GH/GA/BB Performance - NI

### January-December 2023

Room and bed-space occupancy varied across Local Government Districts (LGDs) during January-December 2023. Belfast City LGD recorded the highest room occupancy (60%), while Lisburn and Castlereagh recorded the largest increase in room occupancy compared with January-December 2019 (+13pps).
