Hotel Performance - NI

January-July 2023

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for January-July 2023 indicate hotel room occupancy experienced a minor increase while bed occupancy declined marginally compared with the same period pre-pandemic. Year-to-date room sales have decreased in January-July 2023 compared with 2019. Room occupancy for July 2023 fell by 4 percentage points and room sales declined by 12% compared to July 2019.

Room and Bed Occupancy

- Northern Ireland (NI) year-to-date (YTD) hotel room and bed occupancy figures sit at 67% and 52% respectively. These figures represent no change in room occupancy and a 2 percentage point decline in bed occupancy compared to 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room occupancy in July 2023 (76%) was down by 4 percentage points compared to July 2019. Room occupancy in July 2023 also decreased by 5 percentage points compared to last month (June 2023 – 81% room occupancy).
- NI's 2023 YTD hotel room occupancy is 3 percentage points higher than last year (January-July 2022).

Room and Bed Sales

- Room sales in the month of July 2023 declined by 12% compared to July 2019. We had previously seen a monthly decrease in room sales in May and June 2023 vs 2019.
- YTD room sales remain 6% below January-July 2019. This
 is one percentage point lower than the figure reported in
 last month's report.
- Bed sales in July 2023 decreased by 8% on 2019. This followed from a 2% decline in bed sales reported in June 2023 on the 2019 figure.
- YTD bed sales for January-July 2023 decreased by 2 percentage points compared with 2019.
- Compared to last year (2022), January-July 2023 room and bed sales are both 3% below 2022 levels.

Hotel Performance - NI

January-July 2023

Performance during January-July 2023 varied across NI Local Government Districts (LGD). Belfast City recorded the highest room occupancy of all the NI LGDs (74%) and was the only reporting LGD to experience a growth in YTD room occupancy compared to 2019.

January-July 2023

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for January-July 2023 indicate that guesthouses, guest accommodation and B&Bs (GH/GA/BB) experienced increases in both room occupancy and sales compared to 2019 and 2022 figures. Performance suggests this sector is continuing to progress better in its recovery than hotels.

Room and Bed Occupancy

- Northern Ireland guest houses, guest accommodation and B&Bs (GH/GA/BB) have had a positive January-July 2023 period, with room occupancy experiencing growth of 5 percentage points compared to 2019. Bed occupancy has seen larger growth of 7 percentage points.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room occupancy in the month of July 2023 experienced growth of 2 percentage points compared to the same month in 2019, marking the seventh consecutive month of growth vs 2019.
- GH/GA/BB room occupancy has increased by 3 percentage points, while bed occupancy has decreased by 2 percentage points, in comparison to last month (June 2023).

Room and Bed Sales

- There have been over 305,000 rooms and more than 601,000 bed spaces sold in guest houses, guest accommodation and B&Bs in January-July 2023.
- NI GH/GA/BB room sales for January-July 2023 have increased by 19% compared to January-July 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room sales in July 2023 grew by 8% compared to July 2019. This follows on from increases of 18% in June, 10% in May, 18% in April, 26% in March, 13% in February 2019, and 73% in January 2019.
- Compared to last year (January-July 2022), GH/GA/BB room sales have increased by 3% in 2023.

January-July 2023

Room and bed-space occupancy varied across Local Government Districts (LGDs) during January-July 2023. Belfast City LGD recorded the highest room occupancy (54%), while Lisburn & Castlereagh LGD and Causeway Coast and Glens LGD both recorded the largest increases in room occupancy compared with January-July 2019 (+12pps).
